#### Grade 9 Course Selection Worksheet

Parents and students are asked to complete course selection online on PowerSchool from February 8 through February 14 for current High School students and February 16-21 for incoming grade 9 students. Use this worksheet to help you determine the courses that you will select. The Program of Studies is available on the SHS website.

The REQUIRED SUBJECTS need a teacher recommendation. When you enter the Class Registration screen on PowerSchool, you will see courses that teachers have recommended. You must request these courses now. If you do not have computer access, teacher recommended courses will be requested for your child and your child will meet with his/her counselor to enter electives.

If you have questions about level recommendations, please discuss them with the specific **grade 8 subject area teacher(s)**. You must speak with the level recommender teacher before requesting an override. There is a form available on the SHS Ninth Grade Academy website under Course Selection if you still wish to override a teacher recommendation. This form must be completed, signed, and submitted to your child's School Counseling Office.

The Program of Studies (which explains all the course offerings at SHS) is available on the SHS website.

Complete the online selection process by clicking on the Class Registration icon at the side of the parent portal page. More detailed information about this process is available on the SHS page of the SPS website (www.southingtonschools.org).

To make course selections:

- (1) click on the Class Registration icon at the side of the parent portal page of PowerSchool.
- (2) click on the pencil next to each subject area, including the courses that have been recommended
- (3) click in the box at the front of the course(s) that you want to take
- (4) click okay at the bottom of this pop-up screen

NOTE: There may be more than one page of available courses for each subject area. This is indicated by page numbers at the bottom of the course list. You should see everything on this sheet on PowerSchool.

After you have made all of your course selections, click Submit at the bottom of this screen.

NOTE: STUDENTS WITH AN IEP: Requests for Special Education courses will be discussed at your child's planning meeting and submitted by the students counselor at a later date. Students should choose the course "TBD at PPT" in the core academic areas in the registration portal.

Students should select a minimum of 7.0 credits. 25 Credits are required to graduate.

It is important that you familiarize yourself with the pathways and the changes taking place for next year, order to assist students to select elective courses, they should be thinking about their career pathways. Middle shool students have access to career surveys via Naviance during their middle school years. Students access aviance via Classlink and you can view their results with them. Middle schools have access to three career surveys:

- The Career Cluster Finder is an online questionnaire that helps students discover career clusters that are
  most interesting to them.
- The Career Key is an online career assessment targeted toward middle school students. This assessment provides students with their Holland interest codes.
- StrengthsExplorer® is a strengths assessment that assesses 10 talent themes for individuals and identifies each student's three strongest emerging talents.

#### Vhy Career Pathways:

February 16-21	Middle school students and parents complete online course selections and acceptance of level recommendations
February 22 - March 22	Middle school counselors meet with current 8th grade students to finalize recommendations and ensure course requirements and credit requirements are being met.

## Supporting Career Pathways via a Block Schedule:

sHS will shift to a block schedule for the 2023-2024 school. This schedule will allow students to enroll in and up to 7-8 redits and to have a lunch wave. Lunch will be built into 4 lunch waves (4 waves for grade 9 in the 9th grade cafe). The period 3 bell schedule will be longer to accommodate a 30-minute lunch break for students and staff.
